In 2011 I was awarded the Special Art Prize at the Royal Adelaide Show for a painting of Bertie my British Bulldog and won a solo exhibition of my animal paintings at Art Images Gallery in Norwood in 2012.

I am a realist painter who works with oils to create images of wildlife, domestic pets, and Australian native animals.

My husband and I currently live with two West Highland White Terriers and a British Bulldog as well as a number of rescued and pedigreed cats. I am inspired by their unique personalities and behaviours and try to capture on canvas the beauty, joy and fun that animals bring to our lives.

I also accept pet portrait commissions and try to honour the connection humans have with their pets - sometimes stronger than the bond they have with other humans in their lives!

I appreciate living in a country that has laws protecting animals from abuse and neglect and have great respect for Australians who sacrifice their own comfort to provide no-kill shelters for abused and homeless animals or who have set up agencies in Asian countries to promote the cause of animal welfare.
